Stroller and Baggage Policy

Customers wishing to bring strollers, carts and large items on Kings Transit buses should recognize their personal responsibility to safety. In an effort to assist our riders in maintaining the safety of their children, other customers and our operators, the following guidelines have been developed;

Strollers and Carts

- Strollers should be small, light-weight and foldable. The recommended size should not be larger than 42" x 22.5".
- Upon boarding the bus children should be removed from the stroller and held by the parent or guardian. Those wishing to leave children in a stroller should remain near the front of the bus, utilizing the courtesy seats when available. (Courtesy seats are located near the rear of the smaller buses)
- We do not recommend boarding or exiting high floor buses with your child in a stroller,
- The brake must be engaged at all times when the bus is in motion.
- The stroller should not obstruct the aisle or impede the flow of passengers.
- Mobility-impaired passengers have priority of the courtesy seats.

At the operators' discretion, larger strollers that may impede the flow of passengers when boarding or exiting, or deemed unsafe for transport may be refused entry!

Transit Operators may at any time request that all carts or strollers be folded, especially:

- If the bus is at or near capacity, i.e. customers standing
- In the event that the stroller/cart designated area is required for securing persons in wheelchairs

During busier times, where overcrowding exists, transit operators may have to refuse customer with unfolded strollers.

Passenger Luggage and Large Items

Persons travelling by transit are only permitted to travel with what they can comfortably carry in both arms and can be safely stored on their lap, on the wheel well or under a seat while the bus is in motion. Passengers travelling with larger items is asked to try to travel during off peak hours if possible as the bus may be full or standing room only during peak hours. Safety is our number one priority. The driver has the right to refuse items that may pose a threat or inconvenience to other passengers while the bus is in motion.

Passengers with bags or backpacks are asked to be considerate of other passengers and they manoeuvre on and off the bus. Passengers should also keep seats free for others by keeping bags and backpacks on their lap or under the seat.
